FUSD Teachers are Recognized

The 2014 Coconino County Teacher of the Year Award Ceremony May 1st was a great event. Several FUSD teachers were honored including;

and the SEDI TASC (Teacher Awards for Sustainable Curriculum) Award Teacher Awards for Sustainable Curriculum. Four prizes of \$2,500 each were awarded for a total of \$10,000! The purpose of these awards is to recognize development and implementation of innovative educational approaches that instill in students the importance, value and practicality of local environmental, social and economic aspects of sustainability.

The awards were granted to teachers for the development and implementation of lessons, units or projects that reflect and reinforce the three principles of sustainability: social equity, economic prosperity, and ecological health. The lesson, unit or projects had a clear connection to the environmental, social and economic aspects of sustainability as reflected by the guiding principles of SEDI. The awards were based on innovative approaches, actions taken, and outcomes that demonstrated practical application at the local level.

This year's winners are; Joy Bergeron (DeMiguel) Kristie Kay (Knoles), Josh Armstrong (MEMS), and Jeff Taylor (FHS).

Congratulations to the Class of 2014

As is the case every year FUSD graduates over 600 students and we are proud of every one of them. Highlighting only a few is always difficult because we have so many accomplished students but we would like to introduce you to several. At Coconino High School among the graduates will be Nikaila Glassy, Jarred Kay and Bailey Womble. Nikaila will be fulfilling her lifelong dream of attending a military academy. After 15 months, an application to each academy, 10 interviews, countless essays, interviews and eventual nominations from Representative Ann Kirkpatrick and Senator John McCain. Nikaila has received her appointment to West Point. She spent her high school years in the Jr. ROTC, served as an officer of the National Honor Society, is a student in the CIT (Coconino Institute of Technology) Program where her senior project was on "The Effects of Wing Shape on Turbulence". Nikaila "enjoyed high school but cannot wait to see what opportunities lay ahead." Bailey is also a very accomplished graduating senior. Three weeks before walking across the stage at CHS she will be receiving her Associates Degree from CCC (Coconino Community College) through the CAVIAT (Coconino Association for Vocations, Industry and Technology) Program. Bailey attends the CIT Program while taking her classes at CCC and playing soccer for the CHS Panthers. She will attend one more semester at CCC before entering the Nursing Program at NAU in the spring. Bailey is very proud of her accomplishments "CAVIAT was very good for me, it was nice to interact with college students and the program saved me at least \$10,000 in tuition". Jared is also an outstanding member of the 2014 graduating class. In addition to serving as a board member of Grand Canyon Youth and National Honor Society he is a student in the CIT program and has been accepted to the University of Arizona School of Pharmacy. Jared "had a lot of fun in high school but I am really looking forward to college."



Flagstaff High School has hundreds of high achieving students as well and among them are Ivie Mendonca, Adrian Meyer and Marcus Todechine.

Ivie will be attending Grand Canyon University in the fall to study Athletic Training and plans to work for a professional football team after earning her Master's Degree. Ivie has known what she wants to do since she was seven years old. She chose FHS because of their great Athletic Training Program and the chance to learn from Mr. Lyle. While at FHS she was the treasurer of the Health Occupations Student Association, a team captain on the track and field team, a member of the band and was in the Certified Nurse's Assistant Program in the CAVI-AT Program through which she will receive her CNA certification a few weeks before her high school graduation. In her spare time lvie can be found singing at events to raise money for Habitat for Humanity. Adrian will attend the University of Arizona's Honors College and is still deciding what she wants to major in. After

receiving her academic letter for all four years at FHS she has received the Wildcat Excellence Scholarship. Adrian was cocaptain of the softball team, ran cross country, was a Links Leader, a member of NHS and her freshman year was the Freshman All Region Academic Athlete. Marcus's home is three hours outside of Flagstaff and he has attended FHS and lived in the dormitory for four years. He chose to come to FHS as his brothers and sisters did for the "great education and sports". Marcus will attend ASU to study criminology and upon earning his Bachelor's Degree would like to attend the police academy and join the Navajo Nation Police Force and serve in his home town of Pinon. While at FHS Marcus was a member of the track and field team, the cross country team and in his sophomore year gualified as the captain of the team and was the "most improved wrestler". Marcus also took advantage of the CAVIAT Program through their Law Enforcement classes and will graduate high school with forty two transferable college credits.

At the World Championships in April, the CocoNuts finished qualifying rounds with a record of 8 wins and 2 losses, ranking them 11th out of 100 teams in Newton Division. Two Dean's List Finalists are chosen at every regional, and 10 Winners are chosen from among the Finalists at Championship. Kinney was a finalist at the Arizona Regional. The Dean's List winners are considered FIRST superstars who emulate the values of FIRST.


