AP Academy Diploma with Specialization: This route allows students to focus on a core area of interest (Science, Math, English, or Social Studies), by taking the highest academic level of courses offered at each grade level. A minimum of two additional AP-level courses are required in their final two years (11th and 12th grade) to achieve this distinction.

AP Academy Honors Diploma with Specialization: This route allows students to focus on a core area of interest (Science, Math, English, or Social Studies) while challenging themselves to additional high level courses outside their focus area and with higher grade expectations. Students will also take AP Human Geography (preferably, in their freshman year) to gain skills and study habits to allow them to be successful in future Pre-AP, AP, and college-level courses. A minimum of three additional AP-level courses are required to achieve this distinction.

AP Academy Distinguished Scholar: This route allows students to focus on being academically strong and well-rounded in all four core areas, while demonstrating outstanding scholarship and a commitment to community service. Students will be required to complete 8 AP-level courses over the course of their high school career, including AP Human Geography (preferably in their freshman year). In addition, of those eight courses, students will be required to take at least one AP-level course in each of the four core areas during the course of their final two years of high school (11th and 12th grade). Lastly, students will be required to complete their Senior Capstone Project, which focuses on academic research, community service, or other projects as determined by the student and their faculty capstone-mentor.
