Expanded Flexibility



- The AP Academy believes in producing well rounded students who also have the opportunity to explore any areas of interest at a higher level.
- We believe in providing increased access and opportunity to college preparatory classes for all students.

The AP Academy Options



• The AP Academy can be tailored to students individual interests and academic strengths.

• Students can choose areas of specialization or can take higher level classes in all core areas.

Three Levels of Distinction



- AP Academy Diploma with area specialization
- AP Academy Honors Diploma with specialization
- AP Academy Distinguished Scholar
- Areas of specialization: Science, Math, Social Studies, and English

AP Academy Diploma with area specialization



- 4 years at Pre-AP/AP-level in one core subject
- Choices: Science, Math, English, Social Studies
- Minimum of B in all 4 years
- 2 additional AP-level courses (*B or above*) outside of their specialization in final two years (11th/12th)
- Minimum of 3.2 unweighted GPA

AP Academy Honors Diploma with area specialization



- 4 years at Pre-AP/AP-level in <u>one core subject</u>
- Choices: Science, Math, English, Social Studies
- Minimum of B in all 4 years
- AP Human Geography (preferably in 9th grade)
- 3 additional AP-level courses (*B or above*) beyond those listed above in final two years.
- Minimum of 3.4 unweighted GPA

AP Academy Distinguished Scholar



- Complete 8 total AP-level courses in high school
- Complete at least <u>one</u> AP course in each of the 4 core subject areas in their final two years (Science, Math, English, Social Studies) as part of those 8.
- AP Human Geography is required to be one of the 8
- Students complete the Senior Capstone Project
- Maintain an unweighted GPA of 3.4



- One of only 3 school districts in the state of Arizona to receive this honor.

How to Make the List



- Increased participation/access to AP courses by > 6%
- Increased the percentage of exams taken by Hispanic, American Indian, and Black students
- Improved performance levels of students in 2014 scoring a 3 or higher to those in 2012, unless the district has already attained more than 70 percent of its AP students scoring a 3 or higher.

Scenario #1

AP Academy Diploma with English Specialization

- Within Specialization (*B or above*):
- 9th grade: Pre-AP English 9
- 10th grade: Pre-AP English 10
- 11th grade: AP English Language
- 12th grade: AP English Literature
- 2 additional AP courses (*B or above*):
- 11th grade: AP U.S. History
- 12th grade: AP Environmental Science



Scenario #2

AP Academy Honors Diploma w/ Science Specialization

- Within Specialization (*B or above*):
- 9th grade: Pre-AP Biology
- 10th grade: Pre-AP Chemistry
- 11th grade: AP Biology
- 12th grade: AP Physics
- Additional Requirements (APHG and 3 AP classes):
- 9th grade: AP Human Geography
- 11th grade: AP U.S. History, AP English Language
- 12th grade: AP Calculus



Scenario #3

AP Academy Distinguished Scholar

- Need a total of 8 AP classes. One in each core subject required. APHG required.
- 9th Grade: AP Human Geography*
- 10th Grade: AP World History*
- 11th Grade: AP U.S. History, AP English Language, AP Environmental Science
- 12th Grade: AP Statistics, AP English Literature, AP Government/Economics.
- * others are typically Pre-AP classes at that grade level



How do students know which distinction they will be awarded at graduation?

- During the spring of their senior year, they will fill out a "Petition for Graduation with an AP Academy Diploma".
- This form will ask students to indicate which of the three distinctions they are requesting,
- They will indicate which classes they are claiming for that and they will attach a transcript to it.
